# WELCOME TO THE TABLE

God welcomes us all to the table. As people of God, we each have a ministry to carry out in our own faith or tradition. Around the special table of today's Ordination and Consecration we are participating in an ancient tradition that directs us to God and the Lord's work here on earth. We will take part in the calling of a new bishop to carry on her apostolic ministry of leading, supervising, and uniting the Episcopal Church, as well as to be a faithful pastor and wholesome example for God's whole flock. The participants in today's liturgy represent the diverse but inclusive elements of this Episcopate.

DeDe Duncan-Probe was duly elected by the clergy and lay delegates of the Diocese of Central New York and confirmed by the bishops and standing committees of the dioceses of the Episcopal Church. She is responsible for being one with the apostles in proclaiming the resurrection of Christ and guiding the Church in Central New York.

Although based in centuries of tradition, today's service marks a new beginning for a bishop to listen, to speak, to inspire, to grow, to respond, to imagine. She is called to touch the everyday, spiritual lives of clergy, laity and people of all faiths and traditions. Starting with today's consecration and reception, DeDe Duncan-Probe officially leads this Episcopal Diocese in building together a future that bridges who we are and who we can become. Such harmony begins at the common table, with a hopeful spirit.

# AN OUTLINE OF THE RITES

THE PRESENTATION AND READING OF THE TESTIMONIALS is liturgical confirmation of the new Bishop's election.

**WE ARE ASKED** to listen and to pray aloud, in song and in silence.

THE HOMILY seeks to bring God's word to bear on our own life and ministry.

**THE PRAYER OF ORDINATION** *is offered by the Chief Consecrator after the Examination.* 

**THE LAYING ON OF HANDS** follows the Prayer of Ordination. The Chief Consecrator is joined by the co-consecrators in gathering around the new Bishop for this ritual. The act of the laying on of hands is a gesture of blessing in Christian worship, invoking the Holy Spirit on the new Bishop. It is also a ritual in which the participants admit the new Bishop into the collegial ministry that she will now share with them.

Until this point in the service, the Bishop-elect has been clothed in simple garments that are without vesture distinctive of ecclesiastical order. Now, following the laying on of hands, the new Bishop is clothed in vestments and is presented with a Bible and other symbols and gifts of her new Episcopate.

THE CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST follows. The new Bishop assumes her new ministry as chief pastor of the Diocese and presides at the Eucharist. The Eucharist begins with greetings of peace and bids us to God's table to share in the Bread and the Cup. All who are baptized Christians are invited and welcome to receive Holy Communion. If unable to receive Communion for any reason, you are invited and welcome to receive a blessing.

**FINAL BLESSINGS AND HYMNS** conclude the service of ordination and consecration of the new Bishop.

# PREFACE TO THE ORDINATION RITES

The Holy Scriptures and ancient Christian writers make it clear that from the apostles' time, there have been different ministries within the Church. In particular, since the time of the New Testament, three distinct orders of ordained ministers have been characteristic of Christ's holy catholic Church. First, there is the order of bishops who carry on the apostolic work of leading, supervising, and uniting the Church. Secondly, associated with them are the presbyters, or ordained elders, in subsequent times generally known as priests. Together with the bishops, they take part in the governance of the Church, in the carrying out of its missionary and pastoral work, and in the preaching of the Word of God and administering his holy Sacraments. Thirdly, there are deacons who assist bishops and priests in all of this work. It is also a special responsibility of deacons to minister in Christ's name to the poor, the sick, the suffering, and the helpless.

The persons who are chosen and recognized by the Church as being called by God to the ordained ministry are admitted to these sacred orders by solemn prayer and the laying on of episcopal hands. It has been, and is, the intention and purpose of this Church to maintain and continue these three orders; and for this purpose these services of ordination and consecration are appointed. No persons are allowed to exercise the offices of bishop, priest, or deacon in this Church unless they are so ordained, or have already received such ordination with the laying on of hands by bishops who are themselves duly qualified to confer Holy Orders.

It is also recognized and affirmed that the threefold ministry is not the exclusive property of this portion of Christ's catholic Church, but is a gift from God for the nurture of his people and the proclamation of his Gospel everywhere. Accordingly, the manner of ordaining in this Church is to be such as has been, and is, most generally recognized by Christian people as suitable for the conferring of the sacred orders of bishop, priest, and deacon.

### THE PASTORAL STAFF

Also known as the crozier, the pastoral staff symbolizes Jesus as the Good Shepherd.

# **OPENING ACCLAMATION**

The People standing, the Presiding Bishop says

Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

People And blessed be his kingdom, now and forever.

The Bishop then says

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

# THE PRESENTATIONS

The Bishops and People sit. Representatives of the Diocese, both Clergy and Lay Persons, standing before the Presiding Bishop, present the Bishop-elect, saying

Michael, Bishop in the Church of God, the clergy and people of the Diocese of Central New York, trusting in the guidance of the Holy Spirit, have chosen DeDe Duncan-Probe to be a bishop and chief pastor. We therefore ask you to lay your hands upon her and in the power of the Holy Spirit to consecrate her a bishop in the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

The Presiding Bishop then directs that testimonials of the election be read.

When the reading of the testimonials is ended, the Presiding Bishop requires the following promise from the Bishop-elect

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, I, DeDe Duncan-Probe, chosen Bishop of the Church in Central New York, solemnly declare that I do believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly engage to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of The Episcopal Church.

The Bishop-elect then signs the above Declaration in the sight of all present.

The witnesses add their signatures.

The People then stand.

The Presiding Bishop then says the following, and asks the response of the People

Brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, you have heard testimony given that DeDe Duncan-Probe has been duly and lawfully elected to be a bishop of the Church of God to serve in the Diocese of Central New York. You have been assured of her suitability and that the Church has approved her for this sacred responsibility. Nevertheless, if any of you know any reason why we should not proceed, let it now be made known.

*If no objection is made, the Bishop continues*

That is our will.

Will you uphold DeDe as bishop?

The People respond



The Bishop then says





# THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

**FIRST READING** Isaiah 61:1-8 Common English Bible (To be read in both English and Dinka.)

The LORD God's spirit is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me. He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim release for captives, and liberation for prisoners, to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and a day of vindication for our God, to comfort all who mourn, to provide for Zion's mourners, to give them a crown in place of ashes, oil of joy in place of mourning, a mantle of praise in place of discouragement. They will be called Oaks of Righteousness, planted by the LORD to glorify himself.

They will rebuild the ancient ruins; they will restore formerly deserted places; they will renew ruined cities, places deserted in generations past. Foreigners will stay and shepherd your sheep, and strangers will be your farmers and vinedressers. You will be called The Priests of the LORD; Ministers of Our God, they will say about you. You will feed on the wealth of nations, and fatten yourself on their riches. Instead of shame, their portion will be double; instead of disgrace, they will rejoice over their share. They will possess a double portion in their land; everlasting joy will be theirs. I, the LORD, love justice; I hate robbery and dishonesty. I will faithfully give them their wage, and make with them an enduring covenant.

# SECOND READING II Corinthians 3: 4-9 Common English Bible

(To be read in both English and Karen.)

T his is the confidence that we have through Christ in the presence of God. It isn't that we ourselves are qualified to claim that anything came from us. No, our qualification is from God. He has qualified us as ministers of a new covenant, not based on what is written but on the Spirit, because what is written kills, but the Spirit gives life.

The ministry that brought death was carved in letters on stone tablets. It came with such glory that the Israelites couldn't look for long at Moses' face because his face was shining with glory, even though it was a fading glory. Won't the ministry of the Spirit be much more glorious? If the ministry that brought condemnation has glory, how much more glorious is the ministry that brings righteousness?

# THE GOSPEL John 20: 19-23 Common English Bible

(To be read in both English and Spanish.)

All standing, the Deacon reads the Gospel, first saying

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

It was still the first day of the week. That evening, while the disciples were behind closed doors because they were afraid of the Jewish authorities, Jesus came and stood among them. He said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. When the disciples saw the Lord, they were filled with joy. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so I am sending you." Then he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, they are forgiven; if you don't forgive them, they aren't forgiven."



# THE EXAMINATION

The People sit. The Bishop-elect stands facing the bishops. The Presiding Bishop addresses the Bishop-elect.

My sister, the people have chosen you and have affirmed their trust in you by acclaiming your election. A bishop in God's holy Church is called to be one with the apostles in proclaiming Christ's resurrection and interpreting the Gospel, and to testify to Christ's sovereignty as Lord of lords and King of kings.

You are called to guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church; to celebrate and to provide for the administration of the sacraments of the New Covenant; to ordain priests and deacons and to join in ordaining bishops; and to be in all things a faithful pastor and wholesome example for the entire flock of Christ.

With your fellow bishops you will share in the leadership of the Church throughout the world. Your heritage is the faith of patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and those of every generation who have looked to God in hope. Your joy will be to follow him who came, not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.

Are you persuaded that God has called you to the office of bishop?

Bishop-elect I am so persuaded.

The following questions are then addressed to the Bishop-elect by other bishops

Bishop Goff Will you accept this call and fulfill this trust in obedience to Christ?

Bishop-elect I will obey Christ, and will serve in his name.

Bishop Jones Will you be faithful in prayer, and in the study of Holy Scripture, that you may

have the mind of Christ?

Bishop-elect I will, for he is my help.

Bishop Harris Will you boldly proclaim and interpret the Gospel of Christ, enlightening the

minds and stirring up the conscience of your people?

Bishop-elect I will, in the power of the Spirit.

Bishop Johnston As a chief priest and pastor, will you encourage and support all baptized people

in their gifts and ministries, nourish them from the riches of God's grace, pray for them without ceasing, and celebrate with them the sacraments of our

redemption?

Bishop-elect I will, in the name of Christ, the Shepherd and Bishop of our souls.

Bishop Macholz Will you guard the faith, unity and discipline of the Church?

Bishop-elect I will for the love of God.

Bishop Gray-Reeves Will you share with your fellow bishops in the government of the whole Church;

will you sustain your fellow presbyters and take counsel with them; will you

guide and strengthen the deacons and all others who minister in the Church?

Bishop-elect I will by the grace given to me.

Bishop Harris Will you be merciful to all, show compassion to the poor and strangers, and

defend those who have no helper?

Bishop-elect I will for the sake of Christ.

The People stand.

The Presiding Bishop then says

DeDe, through these promises you have committed yourself to God, to serve his Church in the office of bishop. We therefore call upon you, chosen to be a guardian of the Church's faith, to lead us in confessing that faith.

Bishop-elect We believe in one God.

Then all say together

# **NICENE CREED**

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

# THE CONSECRATION OF THE BISHOP

All continue to stand. The Bishop-elect stands before the Presiding Bishop.

The other bishops stand to the right and left of the Presiding Bishop.

The Choir and congregation sing the following hymn.



Silence is kept, the People still standing.

The Presiding Bishop then begins this Prayer of Consecration

God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Father of mercies and God of all comfort, dwelling on high but having regard for the lowly, knowing all things before they come to pass: We give you thanks that from the beginning you have gathered and prepared a people to be heirs of the covenant of Abraham, and have raised up prophets, kings, and priests, never leaving your temple untended. We praise you also that from the creation you have graciously accepted the ministry of those whom you have chosen.

The Presiding Bishop and other bishops now lay their hands upon the head of the Bishop-elect and say together

Therefore, Father, make DeDe a bishop in your Church. Pour out upon her the power of your princely Spirit, whom you bestowed upon your beloved Son Jesus Christ, with whom he endowed the apostles, and by whom your Church is built up in every place, to the glory and unceasing praise of your Name.

The Presiding Bishop continues

To you, O Father, all hearts are open; fill, we pray, the heart of this your servant whom you have chosen to be a bishop in your Church, with such love of you and of all the people, that she may feed and tend the flock of Christ, and exercise without reproach the high priesthood to which you have called her, serving before you day and night in the ministry of reconciliation, declaring pardon in your Name, offering the holy gifts, and wisely overseeing the life and work of the Church. In all things may she present before you the acceptable offering of a pure, and gentle, and holy life; through Jesus Christ your Son, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, be honor and power and glory in the Church, now and for ever.

The People in a loud voice respond Amen.

The new bishop is now vested according to the order of bishops.

A chasuble is presented by Bishop DeDe's husband, Christopher, and their children, Chasen, Ryan and Grace.

A Bible is presented by Presiding Bishop Curry with these words

Receive the Holy Scriptures. Feed the flock of Christ committed to your charge, guard and defend them in his truth, and be a faithful steward of his holy Word and Sacraments.

The pectoral cross is presented by Ms. Carol Forrester with these words

Receive this pectoral cross, and keep us mindful that the Way of the Cross is none other than the Way of New Life.

The Episcopal ring is presented by the Very Rev. Rebecca Coerper on behalf of the clergy of the Diocese with these words

Receive this ring as a symbol of your office, and guard with love the faith and unity of God's holy Church.

The mitre is presented by the Very Rev. John Crosswaite with these words

Receive this mitre as a sign of the Holy Spirit lighting upon the believers at Pentecost; may the Holy Spirit ever be Comforter and Guide.

The pastoral staff is presented by Bishop Adams with these words

On behalf of the people and clergy of the Diocese of Central New York, I give into your hands this pastoral staff. May Christ the Good Shepherd uphold you and sustain you as you carry it in his name. Amen.

The Presiding Bishop presents to the People their new bishop.

The Clergy and People offer their acclamation and applause.

#### THE PEACE

The new Bishop then says

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

The Presiding Bishop and other Bishops greet the new Bishop. The People greet one another.

The new Bishop also greets other members of the clergy, family members, and the congregation.



At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or to lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

We remember his death,
We proclaim his resurrection,

The Celebrant continues

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.




Gluten free bread is available. Please inform the usher who will direct you to a gluten free communion station.
