

About the service

This Lent, the people of Central New York come together as a diocesan community preparing to follow Jesus Christ into new life at Easter. At two services throughout the Diocese, we share Holy Communion, celebrate our ordained and lay ministers, and renew our Christian yows.

Did you know?



Each of the arms of the **Central New York cross** represent one of the four orders of ministers in the Church: laity, bishops, priests and deacons. All four orders are essential if the cross is truly to be formed and lifted up.

Each arm of the cross is a representative person, arms reaching out to one another and to all creation. Firmly centered in the others, each order moves outward into God's world.

The cross was created in 1983 by Wayne Davison, Arthur Lange, and Dwight Vicks under the leadership of The Rt. Rev. O'Kelley Whitaker, 7th Bishop of Central New York.



The shield on our **diocesan seal** features a cross, the symbol of the Christian Church, situated between four discs with wavy lines which represent the lakes and rivers amongst which the churches of our Diocese are planted. A bishop's mitre (ceremonial headpiece) surmounts the shield, indicating that a bishop serves as Chief Pastor of the Diocese.


The Latin motto on the outer ring of the seal, "Super Aquam Refectionis," may be translated as "by the water of refreshment," or "above the waters of regeneration," speaking both to the waters of baptism and to the lakes and rivers of our diocese beside which we find God's rest and peace. The outer ring also reflects the year, 1868, in which the Diocese was established.

The present diocesan seal was adopted by Diocesan Convention in 1915.



Isaiah 61:1-3, 6, 8-9

The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; to provide for those who mourn in Zion to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, to display his glory. but you shall be called priests of the Lord, you shall be named ministers of our God; you shall enjoy the wealth of the nations, and in their riches you shall glory. For I the Lord love justice, I hate robbery and wrongdoing; I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them. Ephesians 4:1-7, 11-16


I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming. But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the

head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knitted together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

The Renewal of Ordination Vows

Clergy, please remain standing as you are able.

Bishop Dear friends, the ministry we share is none other than the sacrificial ministry of Christ, who gave himself up to death on the cross for the salvation of the world. By his glorious resurrection he has opened for us the way of everlasting life. By the gift of the Holy Spirit he shares with us the riches of his grace.

We are called to proclaim his death and resurrection, to administer the Sacraments of the New Covenant which he sealed with his blood on the cross, and to care for his people in the power of the Spirit.

Do you here, in the presence of Christ and his Church, renew your commitment to your ministry, under the pastoral direction of your bishop?

Clergy I do.

Do you reaffirm your promise to give yourself to prayer and study?

Clergy I do.

Do you reaffirm your promise so to minister the Word of God and the Sacraments of the New Covenant that the reconciling love of Christ may be known and received?

Clergy I do.

Do you reaffirm your promise to be a faithful servant of all those committed to your care, patterning your life in accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to your people?

Clergy I do.

The Bishop then stands and makes this affirmation.





Through the great shepherd of your flock, Jesus Christ our Lord; who after his resurrection sent forth his apostles to preach the Gospel and to teach all nations; and promised to be with them always, even to the end of the ages.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who forever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:



Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."


And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

The Blessing of the Oil for Chrismation

Bishop Dear Friends in Christ:

In the beginning, the Spirit of God hovered over the creation; and, throughout history, God, by the gift of the Holy Spirit, has empowered his people to serve him. As a sign of that gift, the priests and kings of Israel were anointed with oil; and our Lord Jesus was himself anointed with the Holy Spirit at his Baptism as the Christ, God's own Messiah. At Baptism, Christians are likewise anointed by that same Spirit to empower them for God's service. Let us now set apart this oil to be the sign of that anointing.

Let us pray.

Silence.

The Bishop then consecrates the oil of Chrism, saying:

Eternal Father, whose blessed son was anointed by the Holy Spirit to be the Savior and servant of all, we pray you to consecrate this oil, that those who are sealed with it may share in the royal priesthood of Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, forever and ever. Amen.

Clergy may receive the chrism after the service.

Our help is in the Name of the Lord;

People The maker of heaven and earth.

Blessed be the Name of the Lord;

People From this time forth for evermore.

The blessing, mercy, and grace of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be upon

you, and remain with you forever. Amen.
